Benjamin Barylske proudly joined St. Bernards Healthcare as VP of Finance and CFO in October 2018. Previously, he was the CFO for NEA Baptist Clinic, a large multispecialty physician group in Northeast Arkansas, partnered with NEA Baptist Hospital and part of the Baptist Memorial Health Care System out of Memphis, TN. Prior to that, he served as the Chief Financial Officer for the City of Jonesboro, AR where he worked with the mayor to restore the City's financial stability. Mr. Barylske has a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting from Arkansas State University. He has served on numerous community boards and committees in Northeast Arkansas.

Bill Craig joined Howard Memorial Hospital, a 20-bed not-for-profit Critical Access Hospital (CAH) located in Nashville, Arkansas, as Chief Financial Officer in May 2010 through a Management Contract.
